Dear Members & Friends of TCC:

Greetings in the name of our Savior, Jesus Christ! No matter what has happened since March, we are blessed to know God's love and abiding Spirit!

I know these have been tough times, but I will say that I feel very blessed to have had such wonderful weather this summer, my boys got to play baseball, and my family was able to take a trip to Maine. I am also feeling very thankful and blessed in that August 15th marked 15 years that I've been with our congregation.

In normal times, I'd be talking about Rally Day and getting into our fall routines as we enter this month of September. However, as we all know, these are not normal times. As of the writing of this article (Aug. 21), the latest news from the State of CT is an Aug. 14 update. The update simply states that phase 3 (which was supposed to begin July 20 but got delayed) has not yet started but will be announced soon. Meanwhile, the UCC has stated that they will not be updating their guidelines because the best and safest path is to follow one's own state and local health agency's guidelines. The UCC for CT (Southern New England Conference) has also announced that their office buildings will remain closed for duration of the year and all staff will continue to work from home.

So, what does this mean? It means we are still in "wait and see" mode.

Here's an updated version of our frequently asked questions:

When will we be back inside for worship? Our hope is to go back inside for worship at the beginning of September. However, since (as of this article) the Governor of CT has not yet started the July 20th phase (phase 3) of reopening, we really are still not sure. We will keep you posted. In the meantime, worship continues to be outdoors (9:30am for August, then back to 10am starting in September) and will continue also to be online (facebook and youtube).

What is the plan for cleaning the building and keeping it sanitized once we return to indoor gatherings? Our Trustees got several quotes for professional cleaning companies to sanitize our building. As you can imagine, the costs were very expensive. At our July 29th Church Council meeting, the Council voted to use the same cleanser product that the pros use, but to purchase it ourselves and then use our current janitorial service (Homestyle Cleaners) to administer the sanitizer. We will also be purchasing our own misting equipment. Because we have saved money during COVID-19 on some of our budget items, the good news is that this additional cleaning should not bring us too much (if any at all) over budget for the year. Homestyle Cleaners will sanitize the building, then we will be coming up with our own guidelines for how we will wipe down and sanitize between each of our gatherings. We will have these guidelines posted throughout the building, and our plan is to have them ready by the end of August. All individuals/groups that use the building will also have to adhere to the guidelines. We will have hand sanitizer and masks available as well.

When we do return to worship indoors, what will it look like? We will likely need to space out where we sit (and we'll have the pews marked for this), we will likely need masks, and we will likely be advised not to sing (due to the force of breath exhaled and potentially spreading germs). We likely will not have an indoor coffee hour, but we may be able to have an outdoor coffee hour (in nice weather) if we can distance and use disposable cups, etc.

In addition to indoor worship, what about other events that we normally have in Sept-Oct-Nov-etc.? At the recent Church Council meeting, we decided not to have the Christmas Bazaar this year; our October concert/dinner had already been postponed to 2021; and other events such as BINGO are all on hold until we have more information.

What about Sunday school? No decision has been made yet about Sunday school. Again, because we haven't even been given the go-ahead yet for the July 20th phase (phase 3), we are still very much in "wait and see" mode. We will keep you posted. Regardless of what ends up happening with Sunday school, we do plan to continue the online Sunday school videos that we know have been very well received during this pandemic. These videos will start with the beginning of what would have normally been the start of our Sunday school year (week of Sept. 13). We will also be planning an outdoor gathering for our students, and those details will be announced soon.

What can we do (other than worship)? We still have our Raffle Drawing on Sept. 12! Our plan is to have an outdoor event with food, a teacup auction, and live music. The local health department advised that we not have a tag sale, but all our other plans are a go at this time for that day. Please donate to our teacup auction! I am very encouraged that our online videos have received hundreds and - in some cases - thousands of views. The Vacation Bible School videos were especially amazing!

I am also encouraged that many hospitals and some nursing facilities are now allowing visits (in some cases, outdoors only). Please let me know if you or someone you know is in the hospital and would like to receive a visit.

In addition, we continue to reach out to people in need. We just completed our 4th round of care packages (thank you all for your generous donations!) and we are now collecting for our 5th round of packages. I also just applied for a Thomaston Savings Bank Foundation, Inc. grant so that we can continue providing meals for the residents of Eli Terry Retirement and Gosinski Park for the 2020-2021 year. (We can do the meals take-out or to-go if needed).

Finally, we may be able to have some to-go meal fundraisers as a church this fall. This is something we are thinking about.

Please continue to support our church during these times. You can give online at terryvillecongregationalchurch.org or by mailing (or dropping at the office) your pledge. Our church has and continues to be a bright shining light of God's good news and love during these trying times, and we have to keep it going!

Loan Updates

Paid in Full

Merlyn - Altavas, Aklan, Philippines / Personal Housing Expenses

This loan is special because: It helps protect families who are most vulnerable to waterborne diseases. Merlyn works hard to support four children. She is married and has a fish vending business in the Philippines. Merlyn requested a PHP 10,000 loan to build a sanitary toilet for her family. Merlyn is aware that by using the sanitary toilet, she is reducing health and hazard risks to her family and neighbors as well as promoting environment protection.

Rhea Joy - Lapu-Lapu, Cebu, Philippines / Personal Housing Expenses

This loan is special because: It helps protect families who are most vulnerable to waterborne diseases. Rhea Joy works hard to support three children. She is married and has a general store business in the Philippines. She requested a loan through Negros Women for Tomorrow Foundation (NWTF) to pay for materials and labor to construct a sanitary toilet for her family. She is aware that by using the sanitary toilet she is reducing health and hazard risks to her family and neighbors, as well as promoting environmental protection.

New Loan

Jose Rufino - Wiwili, Nicaragua - Coffee Farming

José is a coffee farmer who lives in an isolated community in Nicaragua. He has a seven hectare (1 hectare = 2.47105 acres) farm of which 1.4 hectares is designated to growing and harvesting Fair Trade Certified coffee. This year he has made a plan to improve the nutrition of his coffee plants. This consists of buying inputs like calcium, zinc and boron and to pay for labor to apply the inputs. With this investment José hopes to obtain better results with his harvest in this new cycle




God, be my resting place and my protection
