



By the time you receive this newsletter, we will be in the midst of Holy Week. Holy week this year begins on March 28 with Palm Sunday and continues with the following events:

I want to thank everyone for supporting our dinners! The Chicken dinner was so very successful - sold out days in advance of the event, and the to-go process ran very smoothly and efficiently thanks to our volunteers. Both of these services are happening at our church.

Starting in March, I have started to resume a lot of nursing facility visits as well as in-home visits (following local protocols, of course, and making sure folks have been vaccinated). Please let me know if you know someone who would like to receive a visit (and again, making sure that the protocols will allow for it). As weather permits, outside visits can also happen.

In closing, I have two service project - related things to share. First, I want to share something about our local Plymouth Community Food Pantry. As you hopefully know by now, I recently began serving on the Board of Directors for the Food Pantry. The Pantry is in the midst of a big renovation project. If you don't already know, the Pantry is located in the downstairs Social Hall of the Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church here in town. (The Pantry originated in our church, many years ago, and has gone through a few different locations as it expanded before it eventually landed where it is now). The downstairs Social Hall is being renovated to better fit the needs of those who utilize the pantry to fulfill their food needs. During the renovation, the pantry has moved to the upstairs Social Hall of the Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church. The project began around March 20 and the hope is that it will be complete in mid-May. Sometime in June or July (still being planned), there will be a grand re-opening ceremony. It is important that everyone know that this renovation was made possible by a large, single

donation that came to the food pantry; the renovation is not coming from money that was donated to buy food. If you ever have any questions about the pantry, feel free to ask. The pantry has done an amazing job, especially in this past year, to ensure that our local residents in need are fed. Just as it originated in our church, our church continues to be a big supporter of the pantry -- both in donations as well as many volunteers from our church who work at the pantry. I am happy to serve on the Board and look forward to continued work supporting this important organization in our town.

Second, I want to share something about Rebuilding Together. Many of you may remember that for several years in a row, our congregation helped with Rebuilding Together. Rebuilding Together is a national organization with local branches. For several years, we helped with the New Britain branch. Rebuilding Together serves local people in need by doing yard work and house repairs to people who are low income, disabled, special needs, and/or veterans. At the time when we were helping with the New Britain branch, we did not realize that there is also an active Litchfield County branch. During this past year, I have been in touch with the Litchfield County branch and they are excited to add Terryville to the other number of towns that they help. Therefore, this coming year, we will be able to volunteer with Litchfield County and we can help residents within Terryville with house repairs and yard work. Rebuilding Together projects normally happen on the last Saturday in April every year. However, due to Covid, the 2021 date will be a Saturday in September (either the 18th or 25th, TBA). In the meantime, Rebuilding Together is asking us for three things: 1) Do you know anyone in Terryville who is low income, special needs, disabled, and/or veteran who needs home repairs or yard work? 2) Do you know any contractors or people with expertise in home repairs who would like to volunteer with us in September? If you know either of these, please let me know. 3) Even if you do not have expertise in home repair, you are welcome to volunteer (those with the expertise will tell us and teach us/show us what to do)-- so please start thinking about it, save those dates, and let me know if you would like to volunteer with our team in September.

Norma Noemi - Acari, Peru - Clothing Sales

Norma is a hard-working woman, 43 years old, who lives with her partner and 2 children in the locality of Acari. She works selling clothing in her retail space which, with great effort, she managed to open. Norma is always seeking to have a variety of clothing to attract new customers and keep her existing customers coming back to shop. She asks for the microloan to be able to purchase clothing such as sweaters and school jackets to stock her business, increasing her sales volume. Norma hopes in the future to improve her house and to continue offering her children a good education, so that they become people of many values and professionals.

This loan is special because:

Expands access to financial services for rural clients.

Geogina / Uma, Fiji / Personal Housing Expenses

Geogina and her family survived on just about \$30 a day from selling fish, so the chances of them repairing their home that was damaged by Tropical Cyclone Yasa were slim to none. Everyone on the island of Rabi, where Geogina's village, Uma, is situated has in one way been affected by the recent cyclone, so fish sales have not been good either, further affecting the family. Help has been slow to arrive to the island, so Geogina humbly seeks a loan to make things happen for her family as they need to get back on their feet as soon as possible, especially for the sake of the children. She requests a loan as she hopes to first repair the damage done to their home and because she also wishes to set up a canteen business to feed the family and send the children to school, among many other things. She believes that a canteen business will thrive in the community because food items are imperishable and she is willing to work towards making hers a success.

This loan is special because:

It provides emergency funding to clients affected by tropical cyclone Yasa.


