On Sundays when the weather is warm enough (and not raining), we will be worshiping outdoors where we can better practice safe distancing. We will also be handing out the words to the songs so that everyone can sing along! And, last but not least, we will be having outdoor coffee hour each week after the service!

Other exciting things to note:

- -Rich Sauzedde will be working once again on a community garden. This year, there are 3 plots! The produce goes to our local food pantry. Please be in touch with Rich if you would like to help.
- -Our Confirmation Class will be going on a day-long retreat to Wisdom House on May 16. They will also be visiting our church bell tower sometime this month.
- -Thank you to everyone who helped with both our Chicken BBQ dinner as well as our Roast Beef Dinner both dinners were a huge success!
- -Christian Education Committee will be meeting soon to discuss plans for this summer's Vacation Bible School as well as plans for the resuming of Sunday school (in September).
- -Outreach Committee will be finishing up their season of dinners for local residents on May 1 with a meal for Gosinski Park residents. The next Season of meals will begin in October.
- -We are now on round 8 of care packages for local residents in need. For this round of packages, we are requesting that you donate personal care items. These donations can be dropped off at the church office (activity room) during the week or brought to church on Sunday.
- -May 6 is the National Day of Prayer. Plymouth Cong. Church is hosting a prayer service at 5:30pm on the green in Plymouth, and we will also host one on our church front lawn at 12pm. You are welcome to attend one or both.
- As you may have heard, "Buddy the Beefalo" has been captured and moved to an animal sanctuary in Florida. We still have Buddy T-shirts and TCC reusable grocery bags if you would like to have a piece of this interesting Plymouth history (call the office to order, or you can get them at any of our church events).

Jose Rufino - Wiwili, Nicaragua - Coffee Farming

José is a coffee farmer who lives in an isolated community in Nicaragua. He has a seven hectare (17.3 acres) farm of which 1.4 hectares (3.5 acres) is designated to growing and harvesting Fair Trade Certified coffee. This year he has made a plan to improve the nutrition of his coffee plants. This consists of buying inputs like calcium, zinc and boron and to pay for labor to apply the inputs. With this investment José hopes to obtain better results with his harvest in this new cycle. Best wishes to Jose for a healthy and plentiful harvest.

New Loans

Victor Manuel - Teustepe, Nicaragua / Farming

Victor earns his living by cultivating beans, corn, coffee, and now wheat. In order to provide more for his family, he also raises and sells calves. His three children and his wife give him the necessary strength to continue working toward a better future. Victor is requesting a new Kiva loan in order to buy composts, fertilizers, herbicides, fungicides, and foliar nutrients. (Foliar feeding is a technique of feeding plants by applying liquid fertilizer directly to the leaves. Plants are able to absorb essential elements through their leaves.) Within the next few years, he would like to increase his herd and become a major producer of red beans.


