

Loan Updates

Paid In Full

Miltor Jose - Teustepe, Nicaragua / Retail

For the past 13 years, Miltor has worked the land that he inherited from his father. He also works selling shoes in order to earn additional income and improve his quality of life. Miltor took a loan to further improve his situation by purchasing agricultural supplies to grow squash and cucumbers, as well as 36 pairs of shoes for men, 24 pairs of shoes for women, 24 pairs of sandals, and 36 pairs of shoes for children. His dream is to be the owner of a shoe distribution company. Best wishes go out to Miltor as he continues to expand his business and prosper.

New Loans

Mabinty's Best Farmers Group, Rogbonkoh Mathaka Village, Sierra Leone

Mabinty is the featured borrower of Mabinty's Best Farmers. She is a master farmer in Rogbonkoh Mathaka Village and has a family of four. Mabinty is passionate about farming and volunteers to teach young girls in the village about agriculture.

Mabinty is a seasoned farmer whose rice farming business was hard hit during Sierra Leone's 2014-2017 Ebola crisis. She has since recovered her business but very slowly due to predatory lending and a lack of access to financing.

Mabinty has organized a large group of women who, like her, are currently trapped in a cycle of subsistence and take extremely high-interest loans for poor-quality inputs during planting time. A no-interest Kiva loan will enable this group of determined women to throw off the shackles of predatory lending and expand and prosper.

Additionally, the global COVID-19 pandemic is causing food shortages in some areas of Sierra Leone as imported rice becomes more scarce. A Kiva loan will empower these women to increase their local rice production and enhance food access in Sierra Leone at a time when it is badly needed.

More about this loan and Mountain Lion Agriculture:

Mountain Lion Agriculture (MLA) is a social enterprise working to help smallholder rice farmers in Sierra Leone grow and succeed. Mountain Lion Agriculture provides both low-interest as well as 0% loans to farmers in the form of quality seeds and supports them throughout the production process before buying their rice at a fair price.

This is an interest free loan provided to contract farmers. The loan amount is used to purchase quality rice seeds and other inputs at the beginning of planting season. The loan amount is repaid using paddy rice harvested by farmers. In addition, Mountain Lion Agriculture (MLA) provides market to the farmers for their entire rice harvest at competitive prices with transportation to the milling factory offered by the partner at no additional

costs. By supporting this loan, you are enabling smallholder farmers to access quality farm inputs in order to improve their yield and increase the land under cultivation for increased income.

In addition to any KIVA loan disbursed to these farmers, Mountain Lion Agriculture (mlbr.org) farmers also have access to technical advice, tractor and equipment rentals. With this powerful mix of capital and support, each farmer's annual net income should grow – organically and sustainably – by at least 250%, while growing a much needed staple food (rice) during a time of great food insecurity in Sierra Leone. 
