Miltor Jose - Teustepe, Nicaragua / Retail

For the past 13 years, Miltor has worked the land that he inherited from his father. He also works selling shoes in order to earn additional income and improve his quality of life. Miltor took a loan to further improve his situation by purchasing agricultural supplies to grow squash and cucumbers, as well as 36 pairs of shoes for men, 24 pairs of shoes for women, 24 pairs of sandals, and 36 pairs of shoes for children. His dream is to be the owner of a shoe distribution company. Best wishes go out to Miltor as he continues to expand his business and prosper.

Maricel - Abuyog, Leyte, Philippines / Food Production/Sales

Maricel is 30 years old and single with one child. As her child is still in school, Maricel works very hard to provide for her family. Maricel runs a food vending business in the Philippines, and requested a 6.000 PHP loan through NWTF (Negros Women For Tomorrow Foundation) to buy ingredients for her food production business. Maricel has been in this business for five years. In the future, she would like to save enough money so she could afford to send her child to college.

New Loans Joycelyn - Accra, Ghana - Arts

Joycelyn is an artisan from Ghana who specializes in sterling silver jewelry. With a loan she would like to invest in a bulk purchase of silver. Joycelyn has been selling through NOVICA since 2012. This is her story:

"My mother traded in earrings, necklaces and beads, so I naturally followed up. It has been a challenge working in a male-dominated field; fortunately I am one tough cookie so I don't get pushed over easily. I really appreciate the effort of helping artisans grow their business. I want to thank you for boosting my business and helping me to maintain my workers who are able to take care of their families too. God bless you."
