What many people do not know is that the town of Plymouth has been offering a free program for pre-school for quite a few years now. Once the free program began, it made it very difficult for TNS to get the high numbers of enrollment that it used to get. During September, TNS will be working to clean out materials from their side of the building. Once that is complete, our church will be looking into rental opportunities or other ideas to best utilize that space. We give thanks to God for the many wonderful years of education and caring that TNS provided our community, and we go to God in prayer to seek God's guidance on the future for that space for our church. 
