

No loans were fully paid this month. Although we did receive payments on 5 of our 13 loans.

New Loans

Evelio Enrique - Nicaragua - Wholesale

This loan is special because it includes access to short-term emergency loans.

Evelio is a hard working and determined man. He is dedicated to his business selling salt and lime, an old business that still prevails. His truck is his main tool for work because he moves his products with it. In addition, he sometimes works to transport construction materials. His goal for the future is to make his business into a salt distributor at a national level. With the trust of his lenders, he has requested a new loan to buy bags of salt and lime.

With this loan to Evelio, we have lent to borrowers from all 15 businesses or activities that Kiva supports - Agriculture, Arts, Clothing, Construction, Education, Entertainment, Food, Health, Housing, Manufacturing, Personal Use, Retail, Services, Transportation and Wholesale.

This position helps to procure and arrange the flowers for services and events. This is a rotating monthly volunteer position.

(1) Volunteer for the Personnel Committee (contact Jerry Wunsch if you interested)

This position maintains personnel records, job descriptions and personnel policies. They also coordinate the interviewing, hiring, and evaluation of staff. The role requires reviewing, investigating, and taking appropriate action to resolve employee complaints, problems and/or conflicts. The committee meets as needed.
