Loan Updates

Paid In Full

Mabinty's Best Farmers Group, Rogbonkoh Mathaka Village, Sierra Leone / Farming

Mabinty is the featured borrower of Mabinty's Best Farmers. She is a master farmer in Rogbonkoh Mathaka Village and has a family of four. Mabinty is passionate about farming and volunteers to teach young girls in the village about agriculture. Mabinty is a seasoned farmer whose rice farming business was hard hit during Sierra Leone's 2014-2017 Ebola crisis. She has since recovered her business but very slowly due to predatory lending and a lack of access to financing. Mabinty has organized a large group of women who, like her, are currently trapped in a cycle of subsistence and take extremely high-interest loans for poor-quality inputs during planting time. A no-interest Kiva loan will enable this group of determined women to throw off the shackles of predatory lending and expand and prosper. Additionally, the global COVID-19 pandemic is causing food shortages in some areas of Sierra Leone as imported rice becomes more scarce. Our loan has empowered these women to increase their local rice production and enhance food access in Sierra Leone at a time when it is badly needed. Best wishes to this team of hardworking women as they continue to develop their skills and provide for others in their community.

New Loan

Yosef - Palestine - Sewing

This loan is special because it benefits refugees who have been marginalized.

Yosef is a hardworking young man who tries his utmost to help his family live a decent life. He is a 23-year-old refugee who lives with his family in Tulkarem in the West Bank. Yosef works in sewing and sews beautiful clothes to sell to the customers upon request. This is his only source of income. Yosef turned to Palestine for Credit and Development FATEN to request a loan to buy a sewing machine, yarn, silk, and fabrics for his work. This will increase his production and enhance his income. He hopes you will help by funding his loan.

More about this loan

This loan is facilitated by Kiva's Field Partner, Palestine for Credit & Development (FATEN). Field Partners are local organizations working in communities to vet borrowers, provide services, and administer loans on the ground.

This loan helps Palestinian people, specifically those living in refugee camps throughout the West Bank and Gaza. Palestinian refugee camps have inadequate infrastructure and don't receive the same basic services compared to other Palestinian territories. By supporting this loan, you're helping marginalized people develop their business and meet other important financial needs.
