Dear Members & Friends of TCC:

First, thank you to everyone who responded to our survey about the newsletter! (If we did not hear back from you, you will receive the newsletter the same way you were already receiving it. Also, please remember that if you are receiving the newsletter via email, we need always to have your most up-to-date email address. Finally, if you are receiving it via email, sometimes our email company - mailchimp - will send our emails to your spam or junk folder; please make sure you check those folders regularly so you don't miss any emails from us).

As reported in a previous newsletter, our deacons are now assisting me with visitation. This means that we are going out in 2s - just like the disciples did in Jesus' time! - to spend time with our church members. We visit both shut-ins as well as people we haven't seen in church in a while. Visits happen both in homes as well as the church office. If you or someone you know would like a visit, please let us know. (These visits are not in place of my regular visits, these are in addition to my regular visits).

We have resumed sign-ups for lay reader and usher duties. You may sign up to volunteer to help in these areas on the sign-up sheet in the Social Hall and/or by calling the church office at 860-589-0182. We have resumed committees taking turns hosting coffee hour. This does not mean that the actual committee members have to handle coffee hour each Sunday; it simply means that the committee needs to recruit volunteers to help with coffee hour. In the coming months/year, we will be increasing partnership events with Plymouth Congregational Church. We don't want to "get out of the habit" so - even if you think your committee does not have much to report - please at least give a brief overview of your most recent meeting as well as tell us when your next meeting will be so that we can post it and so that any visitors or guests who may want to attend your meeting can do so. In closing, something I have been reflecting on lately is the Body of Christ. In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul writes that the people (the followers of Christ, the Church) make up the Body of Christ. He explains that each person has a role, and he relates it to how a body has different parts and yet all the parts are important. For example, a leg is very important in a body, as is a nose, an ear, a mouth, an arm, etc. Paul describes how important it is that all the parts contribute so that the body can be as whole as possible. Dear friends, never underestimate your role in the Body of Christ. It takes all of us - with all of our individual skills and talents - to be this church. Just because we've been dealing with covid, again let's not get "out of the habit" of contributing to this body. It takes us all. Let's come together and be the Body of Christ and keep Terryville Congregational Church going strong so that we can continue sharing God's good news in this world!

<u>WE SUPPORT OUR MILITARY</u>: The church continues its support of service men and women in the Town of Plymouth. CHURCH TREASURER CHANGE

Over the past 2 years, it became evident that the Finance Committee needed more timely monthly reports, bill paying, check requests, and other financial transactions to maintain integrity. During the fall of 2021, I began searching for an outside vendor as an alternative to our Treasurer. I met with Candace to discuss the plan. After time, she decided to vacate the position to spend more time with her growing family & job demands.

For those that attended the Annual Meeting February 20, 2022, I presented the solution to use Nesso Wealth. The Nesso Company is a consortium of investment and accounting services. Curt Wilbanks voiced his thoughts about outsourcing the financial services in accordance with the Church Bylaws.

Bob met with Curt during the week of February 21 to further discuss the proposal.

TCC Bylaws provide the authority for the Finance Committee to outsource specific functions of the vacated Treasurer position to a qualified vendor. See paragraph 2 of Article F-1 Finance Committee below:

2. Oversee and have charge of all funds, investments, financial concerns and the financial commitments of the Church.

The specific Treasurer functions are cited below in paragraphs 2, 3, 5, and 7 of article F-2 Treasurer:

2. Receive and have the custody of all monies and funds of the Church, except Legacies and Trust Funds.

3. Provide quarterly statements to contributors regarding their pledge payment status.

5. Pay out monies from funds on the order of the specific Committee responsible for the budgetary item.

7. Make a report to the Church at its Annual Meeting of all monies received and paid out.

The word "Treasurer" in Articles F-3 – Collectors and F-5 ASSISTANT TREASURER shall mean vendor. All bylaw references to the Treasurer being and ex-officio, non-voting member of the Finance Committee are not applicable to a vendor.

COFFEE HOUR IS NOT TRIVIAL



A very important part of Sunday worship come, interestingly enough, *after* the worship service, in the fellowship time which follows. This is the *ministry* we call *Coffee Hour*.

By offering coffee, juice, etc. people hang around and it is during that time that significant things can take place. A visitor can be properly welcomed and we begin to build new friendships. It can also be a time for members to connect with each other and share in joyful celebrations or offer support to each other during times of struggle.

We can also connect with "ministry representatives", that is, members of our various boards and committees. This accomplishes two (2) very important things: 1) it gives each board and committee a chance to "show off" its work by setting up a display and be available to inform people "what you are all about". A time to brag about your accomplishments, describe your short and long range goals, etc. 2) it gives you an opportunity to "network" and develop interests in your committee and hopefully fill vacant slots that occur or create a list of individuals who may be interested in helping with scheduled projects.

Coffee hour should be viewed as a great seed – planting opportunity rather than a drudgery; a blessing rather than a burden.

Enjoy those coffee hours!!!!

<u>Terryville Congregational Church</u> <u>Coffee Hour Instructions</u>



What you need to bring with you:

Package of cookies, cheese and crackers or pastry

Half and Half for coffee and Milk for Tea

Ginger Ale

Fruit Juice

Bag of Ice

Coffee:

You will need to prepare 60 cups of coffee. You should start to percolate it before service starts so it will be ready by the time service is over. Coffee is in a can in the cabinet to the left of the sink. You will need 3 cups of grounds to 60 cups of water (fill to #60 line on large silver percolator). Plug it in and let it brew.

<u>Hot Water</u>

Fill the small silver electric hot water tea pot with water. Plug it in the outlet on the counter in the social hall near the water fountain (make sure pot is pulled out from under cabinets).

<u>Cups</u>

Styrofoam cups should be in the same cabinet with the coffee. Use about 50 for coffee and 10 for tea. Place 25 cups on the left of the coffee hour table and 25 on the right. Place 10 cups on the counter near the hot water tea pot.

Sweeteners, Stirrers and Milk

You need to prepare three containers with a combination of sugar, Sweet N Low, Equal and/or Splenda packets. You will find them on the shelf under the cabinet in the kitchen closest to the small refrigerator. Two containers will go on the coffee hour table. One container will be placed next to the hot water. Pour the milk and half n half just before coffee hour begins. Two pitchers of half n half should be on the coffee hour table (one on each side) and one container of milk should be placed with the hot water. Empty pitchers can be found in the kitchen under the cabinet where the coffee pot is plugged in. Place four spoons on the coffee hour table and one placed with the hot water. Don't forget to put out a basket or container with the tea bags in it.

Cookies, pastry, cheese and crackers

Cookies or other snack items should be placed on a platter and put on the same table as the punch. **Punch/Juice**

Punch/Juice

Use the covered punch/juice dispenser (found on the counter) and empty one container of fruit juice to one half to two thirds of ginger ale. Just before everyone comes down from service, add the bag of ice. Punch cups are located in the upper cabinet all the way to the right of the sink.

Miscellaneous

You should put out napkins on the coffee hour table, the punch table and he counter with the hot water for tea. Please remember to put out a basket for donation.

TCC Ushers Guide

On any given Sunday, you may sign up to be an usher for our worship service. (Sign up in the Social Hall or call the office). We need two ushers for each service. If we only have one usher sign up, that usher needs to recruit another volunteer to help.

Your job as usher is a very important part of the worship service! Be friendly and greet members and guests as they enter church. Newcomers often make up their mind as to whether or not they like a church within the first ten minutes after they arrive – remember this, and make a great first impression of our warm and loving congregation!

The role of our ushers is first to greet people, help hand out bulletins, direct people if they have any questions, and give a welcome bag (found on the shelf in the Narthex) to any new visitors. We also have newsletters available in the Narthex as well as pledge forms and pledge envelopes for anyone who might need them. There are also children's coloring books and activities if any family would like to use them during the service. Finally, the Narthex also has "Our Daily Bread" and other devotionals that are free if anyone would like them.

During the first hymn, please take the worship attendance count. This is easiest to do by standing in the balcony to count.

During the offering, take the plates from the minister and pass them to each pew in the congregation. Bring them back to the altar during the playing of the Doxology and hand them to the minister after the prayer.

Be available during the worship service for any other need that may arrive. After the service, you can help to direct people (especially newcomers) to the Social Hall for Coffee Hour & Fellowship. Thank you for fulfilling this very integral part of our spiritual life!

PREPARATION

TCC LAYREADER GUIDE

Review the printed Order of Worship (Bulletin)

• Arrive and meet with the Minister in the Narthex at least 15 minutes prior to the start of Worship. As may be needed, clarify with him/her the pronunciation of any unfamiliar biblical names/places. (You may also talk during the week leading up to Sunday if needed).

• Proceed to the Altar with the Minister at the start of worship.

WORSHIP SERVICE

• Following the musical prelude and the Minister's opening statements, introduce yourself & ask for any announcements, prayer requests and celebrations from the congregation.

- Read your parts which will usually be one or two scripture readings.
- Help as needed with any special events that may be happening that day, such as a Baptism.
- Stand beside the Minister during the Benediction and proceed to the Narthex with him/her.

Harrisa - Port Vila, Vanuatu - Laundry

This loan is special because it provides women with credit in a country where alternative financing is extremely scarce.

Harrisa resides on the outskirts of Port Vila on the island of Vanuatu with her husband and son. She is 48 years old, and has multiple small businesses she operates. Her husband is a pastor at the local church within their community. Apart from being a pastor, he also operates a small local take away, inspired by his wife's business-minded mentality.

Harrisa's son does not attend school anymore but helps in taking care of the business whenever he is asked to. Harrisa slowly grew her in-home retail shop into a window shop, then expanded into setting up the food take away spot and passed that on to her husband. She has since started expanding her home into small rental apartments. She is now requesting a loan to buy a washing machine. Her goal is to set up a small laundry which her tenants can pay to use. This will benefit her tenants while also generating more income for her and her family. Harrisa is always looking to expand her business ventures.
