Dear Members & Friends of TCC:

I am writing this article having just returned from a wonderful youth retreat at Silver Lake in Sharon, CT. I want to thank Robin & Paul Bilodeau and Wayne Harnish for being adult assistants on this retreat. And thank you to our Deacons who led worship while we were away. This was the first time we've had warm weather at Silver Lake (we tend to do retreats in winter or early spring) and I think after this year we will continue to choose warm weather. The weather allowed us to do all the things that Silver Lake offers -- low ropes, high ropes, time in the woods, walks to the lake, outdoor sports, campfire at night, and more! There are lots of pictures on our church facebook page!

June 5 is Confirmation Sunday! Join us for worship, Holy Communion, and for the celebration of confirming 6 students into our church and the life of faith. I want to thank Jake Armbruster & Eric Armbruster who will be helping with one of our final Confirmation experiences -- a trip to our church bell tower. The students look forward to this special event every year and - like the retreat - we've chosen to do it in warm weather. For students who are finishing 8th grade this year, please note that next year's confirmation class will be starting the 3rd Sunday in September. We're already making exciting plans for next year!

In addition to Confirmation Sunday, the highlight of the month of June is our Annual Church Fair. This year's fair is Saturday, June 11. Please make plans to attend and to help with one of our various offerings: bake sale, Chicken BBQ, food booth, strawberry shortcake, tag sale, and more!

Moving into July... we have some new plans this year! Plymouth Congregational Church extended an invitation to us, and our Deacons happily accepted. The plan is to join together with Plymouth for summer worship. The way it will work is that for one month, worship will be at our church; and for the other month, at Plymouth Congregational. July worship will be at our church (Social Hall in warm weather, so we can use the air conditioning), and August worship services will be at Plymouth Congregational Church. July & August services are at 9:30am. This is, of course, an experiment. If we like it, this could be something we continue in future summers; if not, we at least tried it and accepted an invitation to try something new and different.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) is also going to be a little different this year. We are trying evenings for VBS in hopes that it will help with our volunteer pool (a lot of our volunteers now have day jobs). VBS will be July 18-22 from 6-8:30pm each evening.

Last but not least, we are continuing the potluck dinner/fellowship events that we started in March. Back in March, we held a potluck dinner and invited Plymouth Congregational. Then, in April, we attended a potluck dinner at Plymouth. In May, we roasted marshmallows and had dessert with Plymouth. And now, for July, we are going to have an outdoor picnic with hot dogs, hamburgers, side dishes, and desserts. The event will be held on our front lawn on Saturday, July 30 at 4pm (if weather doesn't allow outdoors, then we will be in our Social Hall). Our church will provide the hot dogs and hamburgers, and everyone else is invited to sign up to bring the side dishes and desserts. Be on the lookout for a sign-up sheet in the Social Hall on Sundays, or you can call the office to sign up.

I wrote "last but not least" too soon. There's more!

- --Town summer concerts will be starting back up, Wednesday evenings (starting June 22) on the Plymouth Green. Our church will be there selling hot dogs & hamburgers. It is a six-concert series, and please note that on the last week the concert is on a Monday (July 25).
- --Our Grand Raffle will be going throughout the summer (winner to be drawn at the Terryville Fair on August 28). Please let us know if you can help sell tickets (we will be sitting in the church parking lot on weekends throughout the summer).
- --Our Music Director search is continuing. We will keep you posted on the progress of the search. As of the writing of this article, we have not received any applications.
- --Our outdoor front stairs have been fixed/restored thank you to Phil Armbruster & helpers!
- --We will be making plans for the Terryville Country Fair our church has a baked goods booth, grand raffle booth, and we will offer an early Sunday morning worship for fair volunteers.

I'll close with this thought. On our youth retreat, our theme was the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12). Paul told the Corinthian people (and us) that we all have a variety of gifts, but we all also come together with those gifts to be the one, united Body of Christ on this earth. No one person or part is better than another; all are equally important and needed to make the body whole. 

COFFEE HOUR IS NOT TRIVIAL



A very important part of Sunday worship come, interestingly enough, *after* the worship service, in the fellowship time which follows. This is the *ministry* we call *Coffee Hour*.

By offering coffee, juice, etc. people hang around and it is during that time that significant things can take place. A visitor can be properly welcomed and we begin to build new friendships. It can also be a time for members to connect with each other and share in joyful celebrations or offer support to each other during times of struggle.

We can also connect with "ministry representatives", that is, members of our various boards and committees. This accomplishes two (2) very important things: 1) it gives each board and committee a chance to "show off" its work by setting up a display and be available to inform people "what you are all about". A time to brag about your accomplishments, describe your short and long range goals, etc. 2) it gives you an opportunity to "network" and develop interests in your committee and hopefully fill vacant slots that occur or create a list of individuals who may be interested in helping with scheduled projects.

Coffee hour should be viewed as a great seed – planting opportunity rather than a drudgery; a blessing rather than a burden.

Enjoy those coffee hours!!!!

Terryville Congregational Church Coffee Hour Instructions



What you need to bring with you:

Package of cookies, cheese and crackers or pastry Half and Half for coffee and Milk for Tea Ginger Ale Fruit Juice Bag of Ice

Coffee:

You will need to prepare 60 cups of coffee. You should start to percolate it before service starts so it will be ready by the time service is over. Coffee is in a can in the cabinet to the left of the sink. You will need 3 cups of grounds to 60 cups of water (fill to #60 line on large silver percolator). Plug it in and let it brew.

Hot Water

Fill the small silver electric hot water tea pot with water. Plug it in the outlet on the counter in the social hall near the water fountain (make sure pot is pulled out from under cabinets).

Cups

Styrofoam cups should be in the same cabinet with the coffee. Use about 50 for coffee and 10 for tea. Place 25 cups on the left of the coffee hour table and 25 on the right. Place 10 cups on the counter near the hot water tea pot.

Sweeteners, Stirrers and Milk

You need to prepare three containers with a combination of sugar, Sweet N Low, Equal and/or Splenda packets. You will find them on the shelf under the cabinet in the kitchen closest to the small refrigerator. Two containers will go on the coffee hour table. One container will be placed next to the hot water. Pour the milk and half n half just before coffee hour begins. Two pitchers of half n half should be on the coffee hour table (one on each side) and one container of milk should be placed with the hot water. Empty pitchers can be found in the kitchen under the cabinet where the coffee pot is plugged in. Place four spoons on the coffee hour table and one placed with the hot water. Don't forget to put out a basket or container with the tea bags in it.

Cookies, pastry, cheese and crackers

Cookies or other snack items should be placed on a platter and put on the same table as the punch.

Punch/Juice

Use the covered punch/juice dispenser (found on the counter) and empty one container of fruit juice to one half to two thirds of ginger ale. Just before everyone comes down from service, add the bag of ice. Punch cups are located in the upper cabinet all the way to the right of the sink.

Miscellaneous

You should put out napkins on the coffee hour table, the punch table and he counter with the hot water for tea. Please remember to put out a basket for donation.

TCC Ushers Guide

On any given Sunday, you may sign up to be an usher for our worship service. (Sign up in the Social Hall or call the office). We need two ushers for each service. If we only have one usher sign up, that usher needs to recruit another volunteer to help.

Your job as usher is a very important part of the worship service! Be friendly and greet members and guests as they enter church. Newcomers often make up their mind as to whether or not they like a church within the first ten minutes after they arrive – remember this, and make a great first impression of our warm and loving congregation!

The role of our ushers is first to greet people, help hand out bulletins, direct people if they have any questions, and give a welcome bag (found on the shelf in the Narthex) to any new visitors. We also have newsletters available in the Narthex as well as pledge forms and pledge envelopes for anyone who might need them. There are also children's coloring books and activities if any family would like to use them during the service. Finally, the Narthex also has "Our Daily Bread" and other devotionals that are free if anyone would like them.

During the first hymn, please take the worship attendance count. This is easiest to do by standing in the balcony to count.

During the offering, take the plates from the minister and pass them to each pew in the congregation. Bring them back to the altar during the playing of the Doxology and hand them to the minister after the prayer.

Be available during the worship service for any other need that may arrive. After the service, you can help to direct people (especially newcomers) to the Social Hall for Coffee Hour & Fellowship. Thank you for fulfilling this very integral part of our spiritual life!

TCC LAYREADER GUIDE

PREPARATION

Review the printed Order of Worship (Bulletin)

- Arrive and meet with the Minister in the Narthex at least 15 minutes prior to the start of Worship. As may be needed, clarify with him/her the pronunciation of any unfamiliar biblical names/places. (You may also talk during the week leading up to Sunday if needed).
- Proceed to the Altar with the Minister at the start of worship.

WORSHIP SERVICE

- Following the musical prelude and the Minister's opening statements, introduce yourself & ask for any announcements, prayer requests and celebrations from the congregation.
- Read your parts which will usually be one or two scripture readings.
- Help as needed with any special events that may be happening that day, such as a Baptism.
- Stand beside the Minister during the Benediction and proceed to the Narthex with him/her.

New Loan Rigoberto, El Salvador - Coffee Farming

This loan is special because it enables farmers to plant basic grains to feed their families.

Rigoberto, 22, is single and has no children. He lives with his grandmother. Rigoberto works in agriculture. He has grown coffee for three years, having learned it from his father. He goes one kilometer from his house to the plot of land he farms and works from 7 a.m. to noon. He's also a day laborer. He needs the loan to buy fertilizer and fungicide to apply to his coffee crop. Rigoberto hopes this year's harvest will be abundant.

More about this loan

This loan is being facilitated by Kiva Field Partner, CrediCampo, a local organization working in communities to vet borrowers, provide services and administer loans in the area of the borrowers. CrediCampo seeks to improve the lives of rural communities and their families in areas including health, education, basic services and infrastructure. CrediCampo's work is crucial in addressing the issue of poverty in El Salvador.

This loan is part of a CrediCampo project to help rural farmers living in extreme poverty plant basic grains to feed their families. Excess product is sold on the local market. These loans are smaller than the typical loans offered by this field partner, and guarantee requirements are also reduced. Individuals who receive this type of loan also get access to technical assistance, information on good environmental practices and increased access to farm inputs like fertilizer. This is considered a high risk loan due to the population and loan purpose, and CrediCampo is one of the very few institutions in El Salvador willing to working with these farmers.
