#### **New Loans**

#### Sonia Del Carmen - El Salvador - Tailoring

Sonia is 52 years old. She is single and has a daughter. She has worked in the tailoring profession for 22 years. She learned in a shop where she was a helper. She works in her home from 8AM until 4PM Sonia needs the loan to buy fabric and thread for her tailoring jobs. She dreams of having a bigger shop and of improving her income.

This loan is special because it supports El Salvadorian artisans to grow their businesses.

#### Update on Sonia Del Carmen's loan

Donation was made to Sonia's loan in July with repayments expected to be completed in December. Much to my surprise Sonia paid her loan in full in August. Sonia must be having success with her tailoring business. We wish her continued success towards her goals of having a bigger shop and improving her income.

#### Nazava Water Filters for Kenya

#### Loan to help provide 20,000 rural Kenyans with safe drinking water.

For their daily drinking water, most households in rural Kenya rely on surface water. Women collect their drinking water from ponds where animals drink and defecate, where laundry is done and people wash themselves. Often people consume this water directly because they lack the means to purchase fuel for boiling. As a result, diarrhea, cholera and other water-borne diseases are rampant.

Nazava Water Filters turn dirty pond, river, rain and tap water into water that's ready to drink without the need for boiling. Nazava started in Indonesia in 2009 and — because of the great need for safe drinking water in Kenya — decided to expand its operations there last year.

In Kenya, Nazava Water Filters Kenya works with a network of sales agents called Safe Water Experts. These Safe Water Experts sell the filters to members of Micro Finance Institutes (MFIs). Through these partnerships, the upfront costs are reduced and clients can pay in monthly installments. Nazava consumers are very excited about their water filters because now they finally have a source of clean, fresh and healthy drinking water in their homes.

Currently the water filters are still imported from the Nazava factory in Indonesia. With this loan, Nazava Kenya aims to import 3,000 water filters to provide safe drinking water to nearly 20,000 Kenyans.

#### Ruth Noemi - El Salvador - Fruits and Vegetables

Ruth is single. She lives with a daughter who is 15 years old. Ruth's business is selling vegetables and fruits. She learned the trade from her family and opened her own business 4 years ago. She works from Monday to Sunday with a schedule of 5:00 am to 6:00 pm. At this time, she does not have any difficulties in operating her business. Her loan request is for working capital to boost her business. She will purchase plantains, pineapple,

tomatoes, potatoes, and other types of fruits and vegetables. She hopes that the investment will serve to strengthen her business and offer better service to her customers. Her dreams are to grow her business and to have financial stability to share a better lifestyle with her family.


