#### **COFFEE HOUR IS NOT TRIVIAL**

#### Terryville Congregational Church Coffee Hour Instructions



#### What you need to bring with you:

Package of cookies, cheese and crackers or pastry Half and Half for coffee and Milk for Tea Ginger Ale Fruit Juice Bag of Ice

#### **Coffee:**

You will need to prepare 60 cups of coffee. You should start to percolate it before service starts so it will be ready by the time service is over. Coffee is in a can in the cabinet to the left of the sink. You will need 3 cups of grounds to 60 cups of water (fill to #60 line on large silver percolator). Plug it in and let it brew.

#### **Hot Water**

Fill the small silver electric hot water tea pot with water. Plug it in the outlet on the counter in the social hall near the water fountain (make sure pot is pulled out from under cabinets).

#### <u>Cups</u>

Styrofoam cups should be in the same cabinet with the coffee. Use about 50 for coffee and 10 for tea. Place 25 cups on the left of the coffee hour table and 25 on the right. Place 10 cups on the counter near the hot water tea pot.

#### **Sweeteners, Stirrers and Milk**

You need to prepare three containers with a combination of sugar, Sweet N Low, Equal and/or Splenda packets. You will find them on the shelf under the cabinet in the kitchen closest to the small refrigerator. Two containers will go on the coffee hour table. One container will be placed next to the hot water. Pour the milk and half n half just before coffee hour begins. Two pitchers of half n half should be on the coffee hour table (one on each side) and one container of milk should be placed with the hot water. Empty pitchers can be found in the kitchen under the cabinet where the coffee pot is plugged in. Place four spoons on the coffee hour table and one placed with the hot water. Don't forget to put out a basket or container with the tea bags in it.

#### Cookies, pastry, cheese and crackers

Cookies or other snack items should be placed on a platter and put on the same table as the punch.

#### Punch/Juice

Use the covered punch/juice dispenser (found on the counter) and empty one container of fruit juice to one half to two thirds of ginger ale. Just before everyone comes down from service, add the bag of ice. Punch cups are located in the upper cabinet all the way to the right of the sink.

#### Miscellaneous

You should put out napkins on the coffee hour table, the punch table and he counter with the hot water for tea. Please remember to put out a basket for donation.

#### USHER/GREETER'S DUTIES

- 1-Always greet people attending church service in a warm and friendly manner.
- 2-Hand them a copy of Sunday's Bulletin, the current Newsletter if they don't have one and answer any questions they may have.
- 3-Once the service starts and <u>during the first hymn</u>, <u>please take the attendance</u>. It is easier to do this from upstairs in the balcony. Count each adult, child and participant in the service.
- 4-<u>During the Offering, take the plates from the minister and pass them to each pew</u> in the congregation. <u>Bring them back to the altar during the playing of the Doxology.</u> At the close of the prayer, hand them to the minister.

Note: Communion is celebrated the first Sunday of each month. Provide the elements to all who wish to participate in communion.

- Arrive and meet with the Minister in the Narthex at least 15 minutes prior to the start of Worship. As may be needed, clarify with him/her the pronunciation of any unfamiliar biblical names/places. (You may also talk during the week leading up to Sunday if needed).
- Proceed to the Altar with the Minister at the start of worship.

#### WORSHIP SERVICE

- Following the musical prelude and the Minister's opening statements, introduce yourself & ask for any announcements, prayer requests and celebrations from the congregation.
- Read your parts which will usually be one or two scripture readings.
- Help as needed with any special events that may be happening that day, such as a Baptism.
- Stand beside the Minister during the Benediction and proceed to the Narthex with him/her.

#### Joycelyn - Accra, Ghana - Arts

Joycelyn is an artisan from Ghana who specializes in sterling silver jewelry. Her loan was requested so she could invest in a bulk purchase of silver. Joycelyn has been selling through NOVICA since 2012. This is her story: "My mother traded in earrings, necklaces and beads, so I naturally followed up. It has been a challenge working in a male-dominated field; fortunately, I am one tough cookie so I don't get pushed over easily. I really appreciate the effort of helping artisans grow their business. I want to thank you for boosting my business and helping me to maintain my workers who are able to take care of their families too. God bless you." #### Guido Fabricio - Educador - Food Sales

Guido Fabricio is 46 years old, widowed, and has a 19-year-old daughter who is a university student. They live at a relative's house in the city of Portoviejo, which was affected by an earthquake on April 16, 2016. This city is rich in its production of vegetables, legumes, and tropical fruits for domestic consumption. Guido is a merchant who sells various products such as cheese, milk, eggs, salprieta [an Ecuadorian condiment], peanuts, butter, and cottage cheese. He delivers his products to his customers in stores and individual households. Guido offers his products through WhatsApp for home delivery and travels to various parts of the city. He goes to the farms every day to acquire fresh products. Guido's loan was used to buy peanuts, crushed peanuts, salprieta, cottage cheese, cheese, and packaging. Part of the loan was used to repair his motorcycle. His dreams are to have a convenience store and to acquire a house of his own.

#### **Laydah - South Pacific - Solomon Islands - Home Improvements**

Laydah is a 33-year-old woman who is married with four children. They live in Honiara, the capital of the Solomon Islands. She runs a small business selling cooked foods such as fish, potatoes, and cassava at the market to earn a living. She has been in this business for ten years. Laydah has been working to build a new house for her family. This loan was requested to pay for additional bags of cement, steel rods, and bricks to fully complete her family's house and provide better living conditions for her family.

#### Harrisa - Vanuatu - Laundry

Harrisa resides on the outskirts of Port Vila on the island of Vanuatu with her husband and son. She is 48 years old. She has multiple small businesses she operates. Her husband is a pastor at the local church within their community. Apart from being a pastor, he also operates a small local take away, inspired by his wife's business-minded mentality.

Harrisa slowly grew her in-home retail shop into a window shop, then expanded into setting up the food take away spot and passed that on to her husband. She has since started expanding her home into small rental apartments. Her loan was requested to buy a washing machine to set up a small laundry which her tenants can pay to use. This will benefit her tenants while also generating more income for her and her family. Harrisa is always looking to expand her business ventures.

#### **New Loans**

Mui – Samoa – Farming

This loan is special because it provides women with credit in a country where alternative financing is extremely scarce.

Mui is 39 years old with six children. She operates a business of selling kava in the community to earn a living. Kava is a beverage or extract made from the Piper methysticum plant. In the South Pacific, it's a popular drink that is used in ceremonies for relaxation. Mui has been doing this for more than two years. She requested a loan to buy kava roots, hand gloves, a wheelbarrow, water tank, rake, shovel and chainsaw to assist her in running the business. Mui's loan is facilitated by Kiva's lending partner South Pacific Business Development (SPBD). SPBD provides financial literacy training to help borrowers better understand their income and expenses. In addition, SPBD improves conditions for families living in poverty by providing accessible credit, training and guidance to help them start, grow and maintain businesses, build assets, finance home improvements and afford to educate their children. Mui hopes to use her business profit to expand her business in the future. ### **Heavens Above Observatory Spring Notes**

I must start by giving a big thank you to Jake Armbruster and Dave Morrell for their hard work in completing the construction of our roll off shed observatory which was named by our Sunday School students last year. With the coming of spring weather we will begin having observing sessions depending on sky conditions and objects which will be visible at that time. Spring is referred to as galaxy season as at this time of year we are looking up above the plain of our Milky Way Galaxy which blocks most distance galaxies with it's dust and gas which is what makes up the stars of our home galaxy.

WE will be looking to observe galaxies in the constellation Leo, Leo Minor and Coma Berenices. These galaxies are at a distance of any where from 20 to 50 million light years away, very dim objects but we will be able to pick some of them up. Unfortunately, this is a poor time for the planets and we will have to wait to latter in the year to start observing them. I will try to pick a few dates which will be good for observing the moon before it gets to close to full phase which makes for a pretty night but a very poor night for astronomical observation.

I am very lucky to have the help of Lisa Dixey and my good friend Paul Lecko with these observing sessions and we may have as many of three telescopes up and running. As we get close to observing time I will inform everyone on the observing dates.


