By offering refreshments (coffee, tea, etc.) people hang around and it is during that time that significant things can take place. A visitor can be properly welcomed and we begin to build new friendships. It can also be a time for members to connect with each other and share in joyful celebrations or offer support to each other during times of struggle.

We can also connect with “ministry representatives”, that is, members of our various boards and committees. It gives you an opportunity to “network” and develop interests in your committee and hopefully fill vacant slots that occur or create a list of individuals who may be interested in helping with scheduled projects.

Coffee hour should be viewed as a great seed – planting opportunity rather than a drudgery; a blessing rather than a burden.

Terryville Congregational Church Coffee Hour Instructions



The following supplies are provided by the church for coffee hour:

Decaf Coffee	Cups
Tea	Napkins
Creamer/Milk	Paper Plates/Plastic Silverware (if necessary)
Sugar	

Coffee:

You will need to prepare 60 cups of coffee. You should start to percolate it before service starts so it will be ready by the time service is over. Coffee is in a can in the cabinet to the left of the sink. You will need 3 cups of grounds to 60 cups of water (fill to #60 line on large silver percolator). Plug it in and let it brew. We usually only brew decaf coffee. However, if we have regular coffee in stock you may choose to make percolate some regular coffee too in a separate coffee maker. The suggested split would be 40 cups of decaf & 20 cups of regular.

Hot Water

Fill the small silver electric hot water tea pot with water. Plug it in the outlet on the counter in the social hall near the water fountain (make sure pot is pulled out from under cabinets).

Cups

Styrofoam cups should be in the same cabinet with the coffee. Use about 50 for coffee and 10 for tea. Place 25 cups on the left of the coffee hour table and 25 on the right. Place 10 cups on the counter near the hot water tea pot.

Sweeteners, Stirrers and Creamer/Milk

You need to prepare three containers with a combination of sugar, Sweet N Low, Equal and/or Splenda packets. You will find them on the shelf under the cabinet in the kitchen closest to the small refrigerator. Two containers will go on the coffee hour table. One container will be placed next to the hot water. Pour the milk and half n half just before coffee hour begins. Two pitchers of half n half should be on the coffee hour table (one on each side) and one container of milk should be placed with the hot water. Empty pitchers can be found in the kitchen under the cabinet where the coffee pot is plugged in. Place four spoons on the coffee hour table and one placed with the hot water. Don't forget to put out a basket or container with the tea bags in it.

****NOTE: THE COMMITTEE OR PERSON(S) HOSTING COFFEE HOUR CAN CHOOSE IF THEY WANT TO PROVIDE SNACKS, JUICE, PUNCH, ETC. WITH THE COFFEE & TEA.****

Instructions for optional snacks, juice, punch, etc.

Cookies, pastry, cheese/crackers, etc.

Cookies or other snack items should be placed on a platter and put on the same table as the punch (if included punch or juice).

Punch (recipe: ginger ale, fruit juice, and ice (the church does not have ice onsite))

Use the enclosed punch/juice dispenser (found on the kitchen counter) and empty one container of fruit juice to one half to two thirds of ginger ale. Just before everyone comes down from service, add the bag of ice. Punch cups are located in the upper cabinet all the way to the right of the sink.

Miscellaneous

You should put out napkins on the coffee hour table, the punch table and the counter with the hot water for tea. Please remember to put out a basket for donations.

- 1-Always greet people attending church service in a warm and friendly manner.

LAYREADER GUIDE

PREPARATION

- The church office will provide you with an advance copy of the Scripture Reading, plus a copy will be on the lectern for your use. Please review the reading and the order of service (Bulletin) as needed.
- Arrive and meet with the Minister in the Narthex at least 15 minutes prior to the start of Worship. As may be needed, clarify with him/her the pronunciation of any unfamiliar biblical names/places. (You may also talk during the week leading up to Sunday if needed).
- Proceed to the Altar with the Minister at the start of worship.

WORSHIP SERVICE

- Following the musical prelude and the Minister's opening statements, introduce yourself & ask for any announcements, prayer requests and celebrations from the congregation.
- Read your parts – which will usually be one or two scripture readings.
- Help as needed with any special events that may be happening that day, such as a Baptism.
- Stand beside the Minister during the Benediction and proceed to the Narthex with him/her.

Francisco - Guatemala - Firewood/Fuel

Francisco lives in a pretty place called Aldea Chuachinup. He is 51 years of age and the father of one child who is attending school. He always seeks to improve his life together with his beloved family. Because of this he established a business buying and selling firewood for his acquaintances, neighbors, and friends in town. Francisco is motivated by this business because over time he is gradually managing to get ahead and to be an exemplary father in his community.

Mauro Dionicio - Ecuador - Farming

Mauro Dionicio is a hardworking man who, on his own land, has crops of corn, yuca, beans, watermelons, and papayas. When he harvests, he sells at the markets in the city or merchants come to his farm to make purchases. His children also work producing artisanal bricks. He sells them to builders and merchants who come to purchase them, and at other times ships them using transport companies he hires to deliver orders within and outside of the country. He is very grateful for the support he receives from the good people who are a constant source of support and encouragement for his family. His loan was to pay for water and transportation and to purchase urea, fertilizers, herbicides, and more to sustain his farm.

Esperanza Asuncion - Ecuador - Clothing Sales

Esperanza Asunción is a great woman who, despite her age, works selling a wide variety of clothing for women, men, and children. She sells her merchandise from her home and advertises it on WhatsApp. She also delivers orders to her customers' homes. She lets them buy on credit and collects payment every eight days. She is very grateful to the people who help her with the loans, so she can continue to increase her sales. Esperanza used her loan to buy robes, pajamas, shorts, leggings, blouses, jeans, dresses, skirts, jumpsuits, children's outfits, shirts, pants, and other items.

Maria Elena - Nicaragua - Toilet and Sanitation Systems

María is a small entrepreneur who wants to improve the conditions in her home by making important repairs to her bathroom. The existing toilet leaks and the infrastructure needs changes to guarantee a safer and more functional space. With the support of her husband, María decided to make these improvements. The loan was used to buy a new toilet, sinks, and ceramic tiles. Not only will these improvements guarantee a more sanitary and pleasant environment in her home, but they will also increase the overall well-being of her family.

María is confident that finishing this project will significantly improve her quality of life. Her long-term vision includes continuing to grow her business, achieving stability, and seeing that her family makes progress within the next few years.

New Loans

Ermelindo De Jesus - Guatemala -

Ermelindo, 28, is in a relationship and his partner works as a cook at a restaurant. His children are in school.. For five years Ermelindo has been working as an assistant bricklayer. He travels half a kilometer from his home to his workplace. His work schedule is from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. He also works in agriculture and grows corn and beans. He needs a loan to buy fertilizers and hire workers to prepare his cropland to plant corn and beans. Ermelindo dreams of his children becoming professionals.

Aileen - Philippines - General Store

Aileen is 38 years old and single. Aileen has a general store business in the Philippines. She requested a loan to buy additional items like canned goods, chips, personal care products, etc., to sell in her store. Aileen has been sustaining her business activities through her past loans. Aileen aspires to save enough money so she can afford to send her children to college.

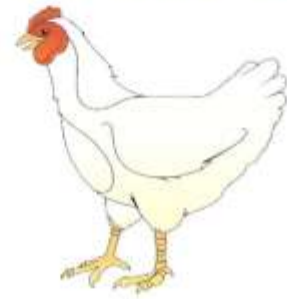
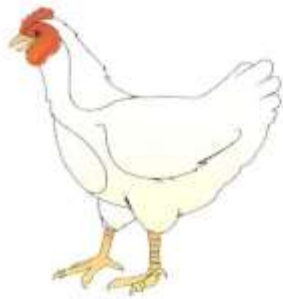

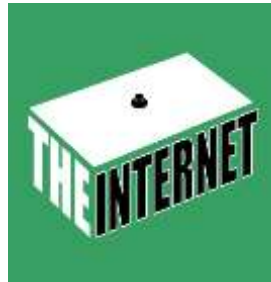
