PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Members & Friends of TCC:

April showers bring May flowers!

Let me start by saying thank you to everyone who is helping with our May 2 church grounds clean up day. Here's what else we have happening this month:

May 3 - Communion

May 7 - National Day of Prayer - 12pm in our courtyard

May 10 - Mother's Day

And reminder - Confirmation Sunday is June 7 and our Annual Church Fair is June 13

Also, reminder that I will be on Sabbatical July-August (I will still be attending mission trip in August).

Sabbatical is designed as 4 months of rest after every 8 years of service in ministry. My last Sabbatical was 2016-2017.

For the betterment of the church (and my own schedule), we decided that instead of 4 months consecutive I would take 2 months, 2 summers in a row. So this means 2026 and 2027 will be Sabbatical for July and August.

Sabbatical is designed to be not returning to church for any reason (otherwise one might end up returning for several reasons). Pastor Denise from Plymouth will be on call for pastoral visits and needs, and she will be leading the summer worship services. We will also have additional clergy as back-ups in case Pastor Denise is not available for certain visitations or other pastoral emergencies. Our Secretary, Tracy, will be able to be in touch with me if we have any deaths or any other major news in the life of the church. Our Moderator (Jerry)

and Deacons can also be in touch, of course. If any major emergency arises, I will be able to call and talk with those in need - but I am not supposed to return in-person during those two months.

How will I spend my time in July/August? I am planning a lengthy trip to North Carolina to visit my father (and hopefully my sister from Ohio can join me). If my sister cannot make the trip to North Carolina, I will also try to make a trip to visit her in Ohio. I am also planning a major de-cluttering of my house (after raising a current 18 year old and 16 year old, a lot of stuff has accumulated!). In addition to this, I plan to rest; listen to tons of music; go fishing with my boys; do lots of praying and reflecting; take long walks with my puppy; and spend lots of time in the sun (with sunscreen, of course!).

Before Sabbatical, I am looking forward to our Confirmation Sunday and June Fair. See you there!

A very important part of Sunday worship come, interestingly enough, *after* the worship service, in the fellowship time which follows. This is the *ministry* we call *Coffee Hour*.

By offering refreshments (coffee, tea, etc.) people hang around and it is during that time that significant things can take place. A visitor can be properly welcomed and we begin to build new friendships. It can also be a time for members to connect with each other and share in joyful celebrations or offer support to each other during times of struggle.

We can also connect with “ministry representatives”, that is, members of our various boards and committees. It gives you an opportunity to “network” and develop interests in your committee and hopefully fill vacant slots that occur or create a list of individuals who may be interested in helping with scheduled projects.

Coffee hour should be viewed as a great seed – planting opportunity rather than a drudgery; a blessing rather than a burden.

Terryville Congregational Church Coffee Hour Instructions



The following supplies are provided by the church for coffee hour:

Decaf Coffee	Cups
Tea	Napkins
Creamer/Milk	Paper Plates/Plastic Silverware (if necessary)
Sugar	

Coffee:

You will need to prepare 60 cups of coffee. You should start to percolate it before service starts so it will be ready by the time service is over. Coffee is in a can in the cabinet to the left of the sink. You will need 3 cups of grounds to 60 cups of water (fill to #60 line on large silver percolator). Plug it in and let it brew. We usually only brew decaf coffee. However, if we have regular coffee in stock you may choose to make percolate some regular coffee too in a separate coffee maker. The suggested split would be 40 cups of decaf & 20 cups of regular.

Hot Water

Fill the small silver electric hot water tea pot with water. Plug it in the outlet on the counter in the social hall near the water fountain (make sure pot is pulled out from under cabinets).

Cups

Styrofoam cups should be in the same cabinet with the coffee. Use about 50 for coffee and 10 for tea. Place 25 cups on the left of the coffee hour table and 25 on the right. Place 10 cups on the counter near the hot water tea pot.

Sweeteners, Stirrers and Creamer/Milk

You need to prepare three containers with a combination of sugar, Sweet N Low, Equal and/or Splenda packets. You will find them on the shelf under the cabinet in the kitchen closest to the small refrigerator. Two containers will go on the coffee hour table. One container will be placed next to the hot water. Pour the milk and half n half just before coffee hour begins. Two pitchers of half n half should be on the coffee hour table (one on each side) and one container of milk should be placed with the hot water. Empty pitchers can be found in the kitchen under the cabinet where the coffee pot is plugged in. Place four spoons on the coffee hour table and one placed with the hot water. Don't forget to put out a basket or container with the tea bags in it.

****NOTE: THE COMMITTEE OR PERSON(S) HOSTING COFFEE HOUR CAN CHOOSE IF THEY WANT TO PROVIDE SNACKS, JUICE, PUNCH, ETC. WITH THE COFFEE & TEA.****

Instructions for optional snacks, juice, punch, etc.

Cookies, pastry, cheese/crackers, etc.

Cookies or other snack items should be placed on a platter and put on the same table as the punch (if included punch or juice).

Punch (recipe: ginger ale, fruit juice, and ice (the church does not have ice onsite))

Use the enclosed punch/juice dispenser (found on the kitchen counter) and empty one container of fruit juice to one half to two thirds of ginger ale. Just before everyone comes down from service, add the bag of ice. Punch cups are located in the upper cabinet all the way to the right of the sink.

Miscellaneous

You should put out napkins on the coffee hour table, the punch table and the counter with the hot water for tea. Please remember to put out a basket for donations.

LAYREADER GUIDE

PREPARATION

- The church office will provide you with an advance copy of the Scripture Reading, plus a copy will be on the lectern for your use. Please review the reading and the order of service (Bulletin) as needed.
- Arrive and meet with the Minister in the Narthex at least 15 minutes prior to the start of Worship. As may be needed, clarify with him/her the pronunciation of any unfamiliar biblical names/places. (You may also talk during the week leading up to Sunday if needed).
- Proceed to the Altar with the Minister at the start of worship.

WORSHIP SERVICE

- Following the musical prelude and the Minister's opening statements, introduce yourself & ask for any announcements, prayer requests and celebrations from the congregation.
- Read your parts – which will usually be one or two scripture readings.
- Help as needed with any special events that may be happening that day, such as a Baptism.
- Stand beside the Minister during the Benediction and proceed to the Narthex with him/her.

Edgar Yojan - Ecuador - Electrician

Edgar Yojan is 27 years old. He is single and lives with his parents in the city of Portoviejo. It is a place with beautiful sites - a mix of countryside landscapes and beaches which are frequented by many tourists all year round. He is a hardworking young man who seeks a way to earn an income and cover the household costs as well as help his family get ahead. He carries out electrical work. He installs electrical cables and completes electrical jobs for the building of homes. He does contract jobs for people who need his services and seek him out for his good work. Edgar used his loan to buy cables, switches, and tools that he needs.

New Loans

Fatima - Timor-Leste - Weaving

Fatima lives in Atsabe, an island in Southeast Asia, with her family. She weaves tais at home and sells them at Tais Market. She learned to weave from her grandmother when she was 15 years old. Every day she's busy weaving. She makes tais and selendang. One tais takes three days to finish. She sells one tais for \$20 to \$50, depending on the size and pattern. With this loan she'll buy more thread in many colors and a new wooden loom. A new loom will enable her to weave more tais. The extra money will help Fatima support her family and pay the children's school fees. She thanks the lenders for the opportunity.

Tais is a traditional, handwoven cotton textile from Timor-Leste, featuring complex patterns and deep cultural significance for ceremonies and social status. Woven by women on backstrap looms, these textiles can be fashioned into *selendang* (narrow scarves) or garments. The practice uses natural dyes and, despite modernization, remains vital to Timorese identity.

Key Aspects of Tais and Selendang Weaving

- **Techniques & Tools:** Weavers mainly use backstrap looms to create plain weaves or complex ikat techniques, where threads are dyed before weaving.
- **Materials & Dyes:** Traditional materials consist of cotton thread, frequently colored with natural dyes derived from plants, including mango skin, turmeric, and cactus flowers.
- **Selendang (Scarves):** Modern *tais* often takes the form of *selendang*—narrow, functional scarves.
- **Cultural Significance:** *Tais* is deeply tied to cultural heritage and is given as a gesture of respect, repentance, or used in marriage, funeral, and ceremonial rituals.
- **Cultural Preservation:** In 2021, *tais* was recognized on the [UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage in Need of Urgent Safeguarding](#) list due to threats from modern alternatives and a decreasing number of practitioners.

Production Process

- **Preparation:** Cotton is cleaned, spun, and dyed, a process that can take significant time.
- **Weaving:** Women in Timor-Leste, specifically, pass down these skills orally. The practice is often done at home as part of daily chores.
- **Motifs:** Designs often feature geometric *Kaif* patterns, which represent nature (birds, crocodiles, fish) and human figures.
